RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE PRELIMINARY 2019/20 SCHOOL YEAR BUDGET

BE IT RESOLVED that the Upper Saddle River Board of Education, County of Bergen, approves the 2019/20 school year budget as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the **GENERAL FUND** tax levy, \$22,672,992 is approved to support Current General Expense and \$869,811 to support Debt Service, for the 2019/20 school year budget.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Upper Saddle River Board of Education requests the approval of a capital reserve withdrawal in the amount of \$300,000. The district intends to utilize these funds for the purchase of a new district-wide Telephone/Emergency Notification/Paging/Clock System.

WHEREAS, school district Policy 6471 and *NJAC 6A:23B-1.2(b)* provides that the Board of Education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted for such travel and expense reimbursement for 2019/20.

WHEREAS, the Upper Saddle River Board of Education appropriated \$27,750 for travel during the 2018/19 school year and has spent \$11,095.72 as of March 15, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Upper Saddle River Board of Education hereby establishes the School District travel maximum for the 2019/20 school year at the sum of \$28,400; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to insure that the maximum amount is not exceeded.
