Mr. DeSocio presented the Annual Schools Self-Assessment for Determining Grades for the 2019/20 school year and the Incidents, Trainings, Programs for Report Period 2 for the 2019/20 school year which is required by the New Jersey Department of Education in accordance with the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act. WHEREAS, the Association accepts a list of advisory positions beyond the September 30 deadline to offer students and staff members opportunities for extracurricular activities suitable for remote platforms.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE BOARD AND ASSOCIATION AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

The Board will seek interested advisors for extracurricular clubs that are suitable on a remote platform. The district administration will review and approve proposals for clubs, including clubs that previously existed and new ones developed for enrichment in a global pandemic. The total number of advisory positions will not exceed the number from each category (A & B) in the contract.

The two parties agree to bypass the September 30 deadline for Board approval of clubs and advisors for the 2020-21 school year due to the global pandemic.
